

Conserving Botswana's Cheetah Population



A species under threat

Humans are responsible for halving the world's cheetah population since the year 2000. A combination of habitat destruction, the illegal wildlife trade, and human-wildlife conflict is pushing this species to the brink of extinction. With only 7,100 cheetahs left on the planet, the time is now to save this species from extinction. The western Kalahari has the highest density of cheetahs in the country and this is where we focus our work.

A dedicated organisation

Established in 2003, Cheetah Conservation Botswana (CCB) has committed itself to working with communities to coexist with the Kalahari's carnivores. With close working relationships with Botswana's Government. community-based organisations and other civil society partners in the region, CCB engages all relevant stakeholders to create sustainable, practical community-based solutions to the threats facing cheetahs and other carnivore species. The organisation has a small but highly committed and dedicated staff complement of 18 (including interns and volunteers) spread between the Gaborone headquarters, Ghanzi field base, and Maun satellite office.
